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Marriage needs three types of love.

These are illustrated in God’s Handbook For Life, the Christian Bible, by three different Greek words for love.

Eros – is the love that seeks sensual expression. It is romantic love, sexual love, the husband and wife, in a good marriage, will love each other romantically and erotically.

Philia – this is the love of friendship. In a good marriage the husband and wife are always friends. Friendship means companionship, communication and co-operation.

Agapé – is a self-giving love, gift love, the love that goes on loving even when our partner is acting unlovably.

Agapé love is not just something that happens to you, it is something you make happen.

Agapé love is a personal act of commitment.

The love that Jesus Christ has for all humanity is gift love, a sacrificial love that does not wane but is unconditional.

Jesus Christ’s love is eternal, and is the perfect love pattern for our marriage.

**Galatians 5:22** [NIV] *“But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,”*

Agapé love is one of the fruits that a relationship with the Holy Spirit can bring into our married life.
